Community and School Information

CCNDS is located in the city of Caguas, one of the eight municipalities of Puerto Rico with more than 100,000 inhabitants. At present CCNDS has an enrollment of 1,042 students (5 to twelve grades). The student body is socio-economically diverse. Approximately seventy-five percent (75%) of our students fall within the upper-middle class income brackets and twenty-five percent (25%) come from families with income below the federal poverty level. CCNDS is accredited by AdvancED, and is licensed by the State Department of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

The school was founded in 1916 as a response to the social and religious conditions of Puerto Rico in its historical context: to lift students from the abject poverty suffered in Puerto Rico through education and professional preparation and to inculcate a vision of social justice according to the wisdom of the Gospel values. The administration and faculty continue to educate the student body with academic excellence so that each person can achieve his her human and spiritual potential, mature in individual responsibility and respect diversity and live in solidarity with the concerns of the poor.

Curriculum

CCNDS (Middle and High School) operates according to a two-semester (four quarters) system on a rotating seven-day schedule. The School curriculum is designed for College-bound students in three tracks. Two of those are specialized, one in the Humanities and the other one in a STEMspecialized track. The maximum course load for students is seven credits per semester. CCNDS provides Advanced Placement, Honor, and regular courses. AP courses are offered in Chemistry, Physics, Spanish and Mathematics. Honor courses are offered in Spanish, English, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, and History. The difficulty level of the course is in the following order: AP, Honors, and Regulars. The curriculum is complemented by thirty-eight extracurricular student organizations and twenty-five athletic teams, and with formal online education with universities. Community hours of service are required every academic year from 7^{th.} To 12^{th.} grade.

Language of Instruction

The primary language of instruction is Spanish. However, all texts used in class are in English with the exception of Spanish, Religious Studies, and Puerto Rican History courses. In grade 6th. through 9th., students have the voluntary option of belonging to groups in which the Science and Mathematics texts and language of instruction are English. Our graduates are fully bilingual.

College Entrance History

CCNDS is a competitive college preparatory school. Ninety-nine percent (99%) of our graduates are accepted into four-year university institutions. Each year several graduates are awarded partial or full academic and/or sports scholarships. Approximately one percent (1%) of the graduates attend a 2-year college institute.

Due largely to economic limitations, the majority of our highly qualified graduates continue their university studies at one of the campuses of the University of Puerto Rico. Other graduates

pursue their studies in many of the prestigious universities in the continental U.S.A. CCND graduates in recent years have been accepted at Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Columbia, MIT, John Hopkins, Tufts, the University of Rochester, the Military Academy at West Point, Emory, Georgia Tech, Purdue, Tulane, Penn, NYU, FIU, UConn, Sunny, Berkley, Michigan State, Syracuse, Columbia, Marquette, Brown University, American University, Iowa State University, Villanova, Notre Dame, SCAD, Loyola University, University of Tampa, George Washington University, Life University, Northeastern University, among others.

University-level and online studies

CCNDS has formal collaborative agreements with fully accredited and prestigious universities, whereby students in grades 11th and 12th are offered the opportunity to initiate university studies through special admission to the Binary Programs of Medicine, Pharmacy, Chiropractic, and Veterinary Science at the Pontifical Catholic University of Puerto Rico in collaboration with the University of the State of Mississippi and the School of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Wisconsin, Madison. Also from grade 11., students can access the University Articulation Program which allows them to earn six (6) university credits per semester and validate up to a maximum of eighteen (18) credits upon admission to the Law School of the PUCPR; furthermore, participants in other concentrations also can earn up to a maximum of 42 university credits free of cost, if they decide to remain in the program or with the disbursement of only 25% of the total credits approved in case of validation at another accredited university of choice

For students interested in Engineering, CCND has a collaborative agreement with the University of Puerto Rico in Mayagüez (RUM) and the Polytechnic University in San Juan where students use the video conferencing facilities of Notre Dame to take core university courses in Engineering. Students interested in the humanities have the opportunity to enroll in courses at the University of Puerto Rico.

CCND also offers the opportunity to take AP and curriculum enrichment courses through the Virtual High School Collaborative. Some of the courses taken online by our students in recent years include Chinese Mandarin Language, German, Russian, AP Biology, AP Physics, AP English Literature and Composition, Video Game Development, Numbers Theory, Biochemistry, and History of Art, among many others. All university-level online courses are weighted a 1.03 to 1.08 factor for GPA purposes, and all online AP-level courses are weighted a 1.08 factor for GPA purposes.

Accreditation
